FROM THE ARCHIVES

Harper Hall, the oldest building on the Claremont Graduate University campus, was built in 1932 and named for Jacob C. Harper, member of the first Board of Trustees for then-named Claremont Graduate School, and attorney to Ellen Browning Scripps, founder of Scripps College. Harper Hall housed the first library for The Claremont Colleges (Pomona, Scripps, CMC and CGS) until Honnold Library was built in 1952.

- All Claremont Colleges libraries' DVDs and videos may be searched in Blais by title, director, or major actors. When searching a title like "Hamlet" that could be a book or a video, limit your search by TYPE OF MATERIAL — videos.
 - For a complete list of all videos held at all CC libraries, search * and limit by TYPE OF MATERIAL — videos, then narrow this by limiting to LOCATION (pick a specific libraries' General Collection), and/or by VIDEOS (VHS or DVD)
 - Notebooks located opposite the Honnold Reference desk are another way to find a video at Honnold Library. Categories are
- COMEDY, DRAMA, INTERNATIONAL (by country), DOCUMENTARY, MUSIC, SHAKESPEARE, and SCIENCE FICTION/FANTASY. Sit down and browse a collection. Or view the web list of Honnold videos from the Media Studies Research guide on our website.

This retrospective exhibition of Grabhorn/Hoyem and Arion Press books, 1966-present, honors master printer, poet, and artist, Andrew Hoyem, Pomona College class of 1957. In 1966, Hoyem formed a partnership with California's premier Grabhorn Press, creating the imprint Grabhorn-Hoyem. In 1974, it was renamed Arion Press.
